Internal Factors

Due to COVID restrictions lack of life experiences, preparation for adulthood and educational experiences have occurred

Lost time through COVID related closures and online learning, particularly in more practical subjects

Lack of self-regulation, emotional understanding and resilience can impact on behaviour towards learning and therefore progress

High proportion of disadvantaged pupils 64%

Erratic attendance due to changing or challenging home circumstances and anxiety around COVID
